National Day of Awareness for Missing and Murdered Women and Girls (MMIW) — May 5

In Canada, Indigenous women and girls are targeted for violence more than any other group. In 2019, a national inquiry named the crisis in Canada a genocide. The in-depth report found that regularly, missing Indigenous women and girls are stereotyped or stigmatized and their family's concerns are dismissed and that more often than not, justice systems are biased towards the perpetrators of murder, kidnapping and worse. In Canada alone, there have been approximately 4000 or more Indigenous murdered or missing women and girls in the last 30 years.

May 5 is an important day to demonstrate respect for the women and girls who have been lost and to honor the communities from the 14 First Nations whose children we serve. We will raise the MMIW flags at the District Office and each school in the District on May 5^{th} .

National Day of Mourning, April 28th

On the **National Day of Mourning, April 28**, Canadians paid tribute to workers who have died, were injured, or made ill from their work. It was also a day on which to collectively renew our commitment to improve health and safety in the workplace and prevent further injuries, illnesses, and deaths.

Workplace injuries and illnesses claimed the lives of 181 B.C. workers last year, with more than half of the work-related deaths the result of occupational disease. This serves as a powerful reminder that employers have an important responsibility to ensure that all workplaces in B.C. are healthy and safe.

On that day, April 28, the Canadian flag was flown at half-mast on Parliament Hill and all federal government buildings. In observance of the National Day of Mourning on April 28, the flags in School District 91 were lowered to half-mast.
