Our Principal's Message



Welcome to fall as we are settling into this school year. We have some important attachments to this newsletter and some notable events in the coming weeks. Attached to the newsletter is both our Code of Conduct and our school Cell Phone policy. Both align with school district policies, and both are reviewed annually with adjustments made in May/June for the coming school year. Please contact the school if you have any questions or concerns.

LDSS releases two lists of names to organizing parent groups related to graduation ceremonies. This does not include any contact information and is for the purpose of ensuring that all students and families are included in these important life

events. Grade 12 student names are released for the planning of the Grande March which is a parent run event. Later in the spring we provide a list of grade 11 students as those students and families assist with set up and clean up the year prior to grad so that in their own graduation year, they are free to enjoy the ceremonies. We have had our school photos. Retakes are October 27th. Next week on Thursday, September 29th, we will have visits from Post Secondary institutions. These information sessions are targeted to our senior students. That same day, we will have a brief assembly to ensure that students have context for the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation on the 30th. Leading up to that, staff have an important day of learning this week on Friday, September 23rd.

As most of you are aware, we, like many employers, are short staffed in all areas of the system including teachers, student support staff, clerical, custodial, and bus drivers. Student and Family Affordability Fund

As announced on August 29, 2022, the Province is helping to make back-to-school more affordable for students and their families who are struggling with rising costs of living due to global inflation. Through the Student and Family Affordability Fund, our school has received funding to ensure students are fed and have the school supplies they need to be successful this year. This one-time funding will help our school to expand food/school meal programs, make sure students have the school supplies they need, and cover any additional fees so that students in need can take part in activities, such as field trips and sports. CODE OF CONDUCT

The purpose of our Code of Conduct is to provide a safe, caring and orderly environment. At LDSS, we respect the diversity of our school community and the Human Rights Code which prohibits discrimination on the grounds of ancestry, race, colour, family or marital status, physical or mental disability, place of origin, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression and age.

At LDSS students are expected to:

- Be aware of and follow all school rules:
- Dress in a way that is appropriate to the learning environment;
- Attend classes punctually and regularly;
- Behave in a safe and responsible manner at all times;
- Work cooperatively and diligently at their studies;
- Respect the rights of all persons within the school;
- Respect the legitimate authority of the school staff;
- Respect the school's facilities and the property of others;
- Respect the diversity of our school community and the BC Human Rights Code.

Examples of unacceptable behaviours include, but are not limited to:

- · Disruptive, disrespectful or unsafe behavior
- Threatening, bullying or harassing behaviours (including social media)
- Wearing clothing with messages of violence, hate, drugs, alcohol, or profanity.
- · Fighting, intimidation and/or threatening behavior
- Possession of weapons, firearms (including replicas or imitations) or any object that is potentially dangerous
- Possession of, or being under the influence of, drugs and/or alcohol
- · Use of tobacco, tobacco products or "vape" type products on school property

Consequences for inappropriate behaviour may include the following:

- Warning
- Restitution or restorative action
- Parent contact and/or meeting
- Time out or alternative workspace
- Suspension (in school or out of school)

Consequences take into account the students' age, and maturity. Special consideration may apply to students with special needs. All reasonable steps will be taken to prevent retaliation by a person against a student who has reported a breach of a code of conduct.

LDSS Cell Phone/Headphone Policy

The staff at LDSS recognize that technology can be a powerful educational tool. We want you to use your phone to enhance learning, without being a distraction to yourself or others.

Guidelines

Here are the general guidelines that teachers and administrators will follow to help students learn to regulate their cell phone use.

- Classroom teachers will post the rules for appropriate cell phone and headphone use.
- Cell phones should be set to Silent or Airplane Mode when students enter a classroom*.
- Phones may only be used in classrooms with express permission from the teacher.
- Phones are not to be used in the gym, office, or restrooms.
- Staff members may confiscate phones of students who do not follow the rules.

Consequences

The following consequences are in place for students who do not follow teachers' posted rules and/or the guidelines listed above**.

1st incident: A verbal warning.

2nd Incident: Teacher keeps phone until the end of block. Teacher will contact parent and inform the office.

3rd Incident: Phone is turned in to the office until end of day. Parent contact will be made and pick up of phone arranged.

4th **incident:** Consequences may include:

- A meeting with parents and administration
- A "phone plan" lasting from 2 to 6 weeks***.
- In School Suspension for 1-3 days.

*Exceptions may be made upon advance notice for students who use phones to monitor documented medical necessities or emergencies such as family illnesses.

**The administration reserves the right to adjust these consequences on a case-by-case basis if needed. For example, extreme behaviors that break the law or engaging in bullying or harassment of other students may result in suspension.

***During this time, the student will be prohibited from using any cell phone on school grounds. The student's phone must remain at home or be turned in to the office at the beginning of each day to be and not picked up until after the end of the instructional day.
