Our Principal's Message



Here we are in May, and I find myself wanting to comment on how busy it is, yet I know I have said that in different ways all year! So, LDSS continues to be an active, vibrant place of learning. Looking forward, we have a number of events and activities coming up. Please continue to check important dates in this newsletter and also from any feature articles.

Tomorrow is National Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls Awareness Day, a time when communities and our allies wear red and gather to remember, honour and give voice to women whose stories have not been heard. Being on Highway 16, the Highway of Tears, makes this day especially relevant to this region. This day is recognition that Indigenous women and children are at increased risk of their personal safety and is a call to action to our community to change this.

In two weeks, the School District will be hosting our second annual "Share the Love" day. In secondary, we teach about many kinds of discrimination such as racism, misogyny and sexual harassment. We strive to create safe and welcoming spaces for all. This is important work, given that 19% of BC high school students identify as gay, lesbian, bisexual or not exclusively heterosexual and 70% of students report hearing homophobic slurs every day in school. The presence of a supportive adult in a young person's life is an important protective factor for youth. As part of the School District's strategic plan we support the goal of honoring diversity by teaching respect for all diversities within our community. All members of the community are to be welcomed, respected, included, accepted and supported in our schools. One strategy to move us towards this important goal is to host an annual awareness day. On that day, at LDSS, students will:

- listen to an address from our superintendent and a guest.
- watch a video on microaggressions and be involved in a teacher led discussion.
- have the option of participating in:
 - o joining an online panel of youth talking about their experiences in school.
 - o joining an online quiz at lunchtime.
 - o meeting with other GSAs virtually.
 - o creating a piece of collaborative art.
 - o participating in an online scavenger hunt (in the week leading up to May 17).

Lastly, term 3 report cards have been mailed home. Please contact teachers directly if you have questions or concerns, especially if your student is struggling in a required course. There is still time for intervention. Following those report cards, we calculate our Distinction, Honour Roll and Principal's lists. This is attached to our newsletter. We honor these students with a lunch (distinction) or sundaes (honour roll and principal's) on days listed on the following pages.

A Comment from the Commons: Study Tips



Have you started **studying** for finals yet? It does seem like it is a long way off before you have to worry about studying for exams, but there are strategies you can use starting now that will make writing final exams a little easier. And the great thing about these strategies is, that they will also help you when writing quizzes and test and some of them are pretty easy to do!

For example: **reviewing classes at the end of every day**. Sometime after your school day is finished review what you did in your classes that day – talk it over with a friend, a coworker or your family. Briefly mention the ideas or concepts you learned or reviewed and describe the activities you did. What did you have a tough time understanding or what made sense to you right away? This oral review of the day should not take long, maybe ten or so minutes, but this short activity is studying.

It brings back to your mind the ideas you learned that day and this type of regular review can help move information from your short-term memory to your long-term memory. Putting information into your long-term memory makes it retrievable weeks later while information in your short-term memory disappears quickly and often cannot be recalled when writing tests or exams.
