Our Principal's Message



Time is marching on and we are looking forward to warm temperatures to accompany the increase in daylight. We are currently engaged in surveys, assessments, academic recognition, and spring activities. Students in grades 10 and 12 have completed the annual Ministry Student Learning Survey. This survey informs our school planning process so we look forward to the initial results. This year we had several classes selected for other surveys and assessments including the Adolescent Health Survey and the Pan-Canadian Assessment Program (PCAP). One grade 8 class wrote the PCAP yesterday, which is a Canada wide assessment. The results

do not come back to the school. Also, this week, three groups will complete the Adolescent Health Survey administered by Northern Health, the health authority receives the anonymous results, and they inform practice. Finally, next week a few students will write Ministry Literacy 10, 12 and Numeracy 10 assessments. This is a make up or rewrite session. A huge thank you goes out to Ms. Karen Isaak and the supervising teachers for managing these activities.

Each year, students who met high academic criteria based on their grade 11 marks, are invited to UNBC. They are offered a free course for next year and were given some university experiences. This event is called UNBC Academic Achievers and was hosted last week. Thank you to Mr. Eric Miller for taking the students on this trip.

There are two events coming later in the spring – Share the Love Day and The Alternative Arts Festival. May 17th is the International Day against Transphobia, Biphobia, and Homophobia. As principal, one of my significant responsibilities is the provision of a safe learning environment for everyone. Every student should feel respected for who they are and feel they are welcome in our school. On May 17th, Share the Love Day, there will be optional activities for students and regular classes. Later newsletters will contain more information. The Alternative Arts Festival is a showcase of visual and performing arts. Students can enter in many categories and there is an array of prizes. This will be the 19th annual (with 3 gap years) festival and it will take place during the school day on Thursday, June the 1st.

Finally, I would like to thank **Ms. Darlene Havens** for her 32+ years' service to School District 91. Darlene's retirement is effective May 1st, 2023. (see next page)
