Dear LDSS Parents / Guardians

Northern Health has just confirmed the 'School Drop-In' vaccination clinics at our school on both Monday, June 7th and Wednesday, June 9th from 9 – 11 am. These drop-in clinics are intended to *offer* the Covid vaccination to students who would like to be vaccinated as per British Columbia's vaccination rollout for 12 – 17 year olds.

If you have already registered your child for a vaccination at a future clinic, they are eligible to be vaccinated at this earlier opportunity. Appointments are not needed for these vaccination clinics, and we will be helping to coordinate how students will access the clinic during school hours. Due to the volume of students, parents wishing to attend the vaccination with their child should wait for a community clinic.

Although we are hopeful that most of our students will be vaccinated, this is not a mandatory vaccination and for students who are unsure or undecided about vaccination, they do not need to attend the drop-in clinic as there will be future community vaccination opportunities.
