Parent / Teacher Communication

What you can expect from us; What we need from you

Welcome to Semester 2! As we continually work to strengthen home/school communication to increase student success, you can expect:

The school will contact you when:

- · There is an attendance concern.
- · Assignments are not being completed.
- The student is having difficulty understanding the course work.
- · Behavior is inappropriate and not quickly resolved.

We ask that parents/guardians:

- Email teachers first directly to discuss concerns.
- · Notify the office (250-692-7733) regarding absences for illness and appointments.
- · Give at least 2 weeks' notice for extended absences during the school year.

Teachers are not expected to package up learning. Classroom instruction is a dynamic, face to face experience. Much of teachers' assessment is based on observation of students engaged in tasks, that cannot be replaced by a worksheet or assignment. Students who miss classes, miss learning.

All members of the school community need to understand:

- Excusing a student still shows up as an absence.
- · Excusing a student ahead of time prevents the daily attendance callout.
- · When students miss learning it is their responsibility to make up that learning.
