Our Principal's Message

We are quickly approaching the end of 2023 and early in the new year the first semester will end. There will be some important dates coming up quickly once we

hit the new year.



Informal Learning Updates will be mailed home before the winter break, only for students who are not currently passing their courses. If you want to check on your child's progress, you can email the teacher at any time.

The week of January 22-26 is the last week of the semester. Ministry assessments for grades 10, 11, and 12 will be scheduled for the beginning of that week. Not all students need to write these and students are encouraged to check the lists that will be posted in early January. Wednesday and

Thursday of that week are for in school assessments. Friday, January 26 is for missed assessments and assignment completion. Semester 2 will start on Monday, January 29 with a short homeroom.

Attached to this newsletter you will find the Honor Roll for Term 1. To achieve Honor Roll status, students must be fully proficient (grades 8 and 9) or have a B average (73% and above). Students with excellent attendance, missing 5 days or less, not including school activities, make the Principal's List. Students can also be nominated to this list for excellent work habits. The distinction list, for grades 10, 11, 12 is based on an A average (86% and above). Students in grades 8 and 9 will have distinction criteria in Term 2.

Spotlight on Staff - Mrs. Dube

My name is Patti Dubé (Wadsworth). Pat and I arrived in Burns Lake the summer of 1990. My teaching assignment was in Granisle and his was here at LDSS. We lived in Granisle that first year and Pat commuted to BL each day. Granisle is a beautiful area, and I thoroughly enjoyed my time there but with the mine closing I took a job at LDSS.

What do I do? What have I done? I have taught English, Foods, Careers, Family Management, librarian at 2 elementary schools (briefly) and, of course, Physical Education. One of my passions is to get students outside not only school but Burns Lake. I have taught outdoor educational activities



(canoeing, hiking, mountain biking), I coached girls' soccer for 10 years, basketball at all levels, volleyball, skiing and snowboarding for 20 years and mountain biking for approximately 15 years. I worked with students on Student Voice for approximately 15 years where students learned that giving back not only to our community but to people around the world makes a difference.

I have been coaching my entire career and feel that it is the best way to make connections with the students.

With these teams and through Student Voice I have taken students all over the province and to different parts of the world.

I have been athletic director and PE department head for most of my career. Organizing games, bussing, coaches, referees and purchasing equipment.

In careers, I organize students to participate in District initiatives, apprenticeship opportunities and CTC Trades courses. I teach Career Life Connections 12, I find work placements for students and help students with career advice.


What is "Extending" in Grade 8 and 9

With the new Reporting Order for BC schools, the goal in grades 8 and 9 is to become or achieve "Proficient". For students who achieve a high level of proficiency, what then is "Extending". The ministry of education defines Extending as "demonstrating a sophisticated understanding of the concepts and competencies relevant to the expected learning". It is about going deeper into a concept, finding unique ways, being innovative, and applying their knowledge, skills, and understanding in new ways. Extending **comes from the learner**. Teachers do not hand out "extending" assignments. Students who are already proficient are being encouraged to explore concepts further, to deepen their learning, to create a portfolio of work that shows this achievement. For learners on a path to post secondary, this is a very important aspect of taking responsibility for their own learning and becoming independent. If you your child is interested in pursuing extensions, please have then reach out to their teacher or to me directly with ideas.

When Will You Receive a Absence Call Home?

The automatic callout is set to run if the **student misses all or most of the class** without being excused. If this happens and you want more information, we encourage you to call the school and find out which class. We sometimes make mistakes, so we can correct it if that is the case.

You will NOT get a call if your child is late, only if absent.
