Our Principal's Message



This newsletter comes to you in the last full week of regular classes. What is Grade 13?

There isn't actually a grade 13 in BC public schools. However students have always had until age 19 to complete their graduation requirements. Every year, we have a dozen or more students doing that. There is no way around it with the pandemic has interrupted learning for students. No matter how diligent a student has been, circumstances may have caused them to fall behind or not take a course that they had planned on or need for post secondary. We regularly remind students of these options and did so this week. Please be aware that:

- A student may retake a course to improve understanding (this would be in the place of an elective or could be done in an extra semester).
- If a student took Workplace Math and wants to take Foundations or Pre-Calculus, they can start with FMP 10 and then move on to the grade 11/12 course of choice.
- Next semester, there is still some space in English 11, English 12, Biology 11 and FMP 10, Earth Science 11 and Astronomy 12.
- Homework help is available every day before school, at lunch and after school

Daily Health Check for Students (Parents)

Updated January 12, 2022

Parents and caregivers must perform a daily health check and follow directions as to when students must stay home:

Symptoms		What To Do			
FeverChillsCough	Loss of sense of smell or tasteDifficulty breathing	1 or more of these symptoms: Get tested and stay home.			
Sore throatLoss of appetiteHeadacheBody aches	Extreme fatigue or tirednessNausea or vomitingDiarrhea	If you have 1 symptom: Stay home until you feel better. 2 or more of these symptoms: Stay home and wait 24 hours to see if you feel better. Get tested if not better after 24 hours.

Get tested and stay home.

Self Monitoring for Close Contacts

Monitor for symptoms of COVID-19 listed above for 14 days from the day you last had contact with the person who has
COVID-19, even if you are fully vaccinated or had COVID-19 in the last 90 days. If you develop symptoms of COVID-19 listed
above, please use the <u>BC COVID-19 Self-Assessment Tool</u> to see if you should get tested for COVID-19.

Self-Isolation for Close Contacts

- If you are **fully vaccinated or had COVID-19 in the last 90 days**, including children with two doses, you are not required to self-isolate but should self-monitor closely. If an individual develops symptoms they should isolate immediately and isolate for five days. Please note, symptoms override close contact status in terms of self-management.
- If you are **not fully vaccinated and did not have COVID-19 in the last 90 days**, you are required to self-isolate for 10 days from the day you last had contact with the person who has COVID-19, even if you do not have any symptoms. If an individual goes on to develop symptoms and tests positive, their isolation is five days from their onset of symptoms which may end up shorter than the initial 10 days.

Stay Home When Required to Self-Isolate

When you self-isolate, you stay home and keep away from others to help stop the spread of COVID-19. You should self-isolate

- You have symptoms of COVID-19.
- You are a close contact of someone with COVID-19 and you are not fully vaccinated.
- You have been asked to self-isolate by public health or because of recent travel.
