

REGISTRATION FOR NEW STUDENTS OR NEW KINDERGARTEN STUDENTS

Registration for all students who are **new to this District**, **who have not yet registered for kindergarten**, or **entering the public school system from an independent school** will take place in the school listed below on the dates indicated <u>during the hours of 9:00 am - 12:00 noon and 1:00 pm - 3:00 pm, unless otherwise stated. Elementary students who attended a public school entering high school in the same town and students who are returning to their same school as last year do not need to re-register.</u>

Report cards or transfer records should be presented to the school upon registration to assist in proper placement in the school. Please bring the student's birth certificate/care card or BC Services Card.

Beginning students (Kindergarten and Grade One) who have already registered should not re-register.
