

COMMUNITY SCHOLARSHIP BOOKLET 2024

It is your responsibility to carefully read each award before applying. You must ensure that you are eligible to apply for the award. Several bursaries and scholarships are for specific programs to be completed at post-secondary school. Do not be deceitful and apply for awards in specific programs that you know you are not going to pursue. Also, if you do not plan on attending post-secondary school in the fall, make sure the award can be deferred. Awards explain if they can be deferred in the write ups. Some awards have on-line applications to complete, or different due dates, or require you mail to a specific address. Please take the time to ensure that you have filled out the application entirely and included any required documents. Incomplete applications may not be considered. You may have to write an additional essay or complete an additional application form (some are kept in the office)

Be sure to complete a separate application for each award you are applying for and include a copy of:

A letter of	intent
A transcrip	t
A resume	
Reference	letters

It is easiest to make several copies of the application form (once you complete your information on it) and all your supporting documents before you get started.

WHAT TO INCLUDE IN YOUR LETTER OF INTENT

Your letter should specify the following:

- Intended course of studies or career option (include the name of post-secondary school if you have applied or have conditional acceptance). Is it an out of province school?
- School activities you were involved in (sports teams, specialized programs such as dance or drama, Student Voice, Career Projects, Grad committee, school yearbook, time keeping, scorekeeping etc.)
- School achievements or awards you received (Honor roll, honor roll with distinction, Fine Arts, academic awards, athletic achievements etc.)
- Community involvements (include community awards, volunteer work, sports, coaching, work, extra - curricular activities etc.)

Emphasize special circumstances or qualifications not already noted in the above prompts. A typewritten response is preferred.

ELIGIBILITY

- 1. The \$3,000 Award is available to any registered student graduating from Lakes District Secondary School who is a Canadian Citizen or Landed Immigrant. The Health Care Auxiliary committee will choose the recipient whose name will then be announced at Graduation.
- 2. Applicants must complete and include the Burns Lake and District Health Care Auxiliary Application form or your application for the Bursary will not be considered.
- 3. Applicants must supply a personal letter stating reasons for choosing this field of study and why he or she feels they are deserving candidates.
- 4. The Award is available to a student going into any field of study related to Human Health Sciences and/or Mental Health and Addictions Fields. Some examples being: Physiotherapy, Medical Doctor, Nursing, Lab Technician, X-Ray Technician, Kinesiology, Medical Researcher, Dentistry, Pharmacy, Optometry or Audiology and Recreational. Extra consideration will be given to applicants who have volunteered or worked in similar fields.
- 5. A letter of reference from the principal or school counsellor must accompany the Awards Application, along with your last transcripts of Grade 11 and Current Grade 12. Also include at least one additional letter of reference (i.e., one from someone for whom you volunteered or worked).
- 6. The first installment of \$1,500 will be paid upon the student providing proof of Registration and acceptance in a post-secondary institution, such as a college, university, or certified training institution. This proof must be received within eighteen (18) months of the awarding of the award.
- 7. The second installment of \$1,500 will be paid upon the student providing proof of registration and acceptance in a post-secondary institution, as described above, for a continuing term. Proof of registration for the second semester or term must be received within six (6) months of proof of registration for the first semester or term.

Number of Awards: 1

Eligibility:

- 1. Open to all successfully graduating Grade 12 secondary school students in the geographic regions served by the College of New Caledonia, who have applied and paid the tuition deposit for full-time classes.
- 2. Must be registered full time at the College of New Caledonia, any campus, in University transfer/credit courses in Arts, Science, Health Science, Business Administration, Foundation Trades & Technology Diploma programs
- 3. Selection will be based on a) participation in community activities, b) evidence of leadership abilities, c) career goal, d) financial need, e) satisfactory academic achievement.

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DR. LOREN CAIRA MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Medical Staff Association of Burns Lake is honoring the memory of Dr. Loren Caira with this award. Dr. Loren Caira served Burns Lake from 2012 until his retirement in 2020. He distinguished himself when he managed all casualties in the 2012 Babine Forest Products Mill explosion. The injured included six critically ill patients that required intubation and ventilation...all survived.

Loren's initial undergraduate training was in psychology and biology. He was a commercially rated diver and assisted his sister with her parasitology studies with sharks and stingrays. Loren completed his medical school studies at the University of British Columbia and his Emergency Medicine Residency at the University of California. He placed third in the American National Proficiency Exam for Emergency Medicine after he completed his residency.

Dr. Caira was admired and loved by his colleagues and patients in Burns Lake.
